Kiyām Community Park Official Opening On **January 24, 2023,** more than 100

community leaders and guests assembled at Kiyām Community Park, in the area closest to the intersection of Franklin Avenue and Main Street, for the official opening ceremonies. The ceremony featured an Indigenous honour song, followed by singing of the national anthem in Cree and English as five flags representing Canada, Alberta, RMWB, Treaty 8 and Métis were raised, followed by an official ribbon cutting.
