National Indigenous History Month

The Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo, in collaboration with local Indigenous community partners, will honour National Indigenous History Month in virtual ways this June. Indigenous history is a shared history, and National Indigenous History Month provides an important opportunity to recognize the historic contributions and challenges First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples have experienced in the development of Canada.

Throughout the month, the Municipality's social media channels will feature content by Indigenous community members that raise awareness and understanding about the Indigenous history, cultures, and traditions in the Region. Each week, new content will be shared in collaboration with Indigenous communities with the general themes: Mother Earth Mondays, Wisdom Wednesdays, and Fact Fridays.

People may also join online discussions and participate in a weekly contest for a chance to win a hand-made birchbark basket filled with special items purchased from local Indigenous artisans and companies.
