About the Project

The Franklin and Main Park project supports downtown revitalization and is one of Council's key priorities part of the 2018-2021 Strategic Plan. As part of downtown revitalization, significant public engagement was held between May and September 2019. Reoccurring themes from these engagements supported a new downtown park by indicating beautification, parks, outdoors, and addressing vacant land as priorities. In addition to approved Council documents, resolutions and the previous Land Planning and Development Committee recommendations.

In March 2020, the Wood Buffalo Downtown Revitalization Advisory Committee (WBDRAC) proposed the Franklin & Main Park and Council approved the Franklin and Main Park Project. Public engagement started fall 2020 and was separated into two phases; Phase 1 understanding focused priorities and appropriate amenities and Phase 2 understanding the community's preference from two concept designs (winter and summer).

The information within this public engagement summary report provides details of the poll, engagement tactics, and overall themes from Phase 2 public engagement.


