ABOUT THE PROJECT

Neighbourhood Engagements are opportunities to share information from the Municipality, have discussion about the topics that matter most to residents, and talk about ways we can work together to create more vibrant, healthy, and inclusive neighbourhoods. In June we set out to Gregoire to host a Neighbourhood Engagement at Greely Road School.

The June series was set in Gregoire due to a motion passed by Council for Administration to review and bring back a report regarding the potential of a skate park in Gregoire. Public engagement was identified to strengthen this report by including community sentiment on this suggested project. In addition, we had information to follow up with from the March Neighbourhood Engagement held in Gregoire along with municipal project updates to share with community members.

OVERVIEW

In June we held one Neighbourhood Engagement at Greely Road School. This was an open space meeting set outside in the Greely Road School parking lot. Information was presented cafeteria-style allowing residents to choose which station to participate in. The format was a drop-in style event where residents could stay as long as they like and converse with onsite subject matter experts. A barbeque, music playing, and recreational equipment was set up on the sport fields which created a relaxed and inviting environment for residents to provide feedback and ask questions on topics relevant and important to them.

We asked for feedback and community sentiment regarding the potential skate park in Gregoire. The school principal Christopher Organ, and the schoolteacher that supported the children presenting at Council as well as the RMWB Parks team were present to welcome families and answer questions.

In the March Neighbourhood Engagement Series Gregoire residents requested the return of their recycling bin at Fire Hall 2. We were happy to report that the return of the recycling bin was underway. In addition to asking participants what is important to them, we provided an update on the construction of the Gregoire storm outfall structure, which will upgrade the storm drainage system and reduce the risk of flooding in the area. A map of project upgrades, and construction notices were on hand and facilitators encouraged residents to sign up to receive construction updates. A member from the RCMP was also on site to educate residents and answer law enforcement questions.

 The end of the school zone on Greely Road marks the end of Municipal land, the rest of Greely Road is on privatized land. Road signs here would need to be put in place by the local condominium association. Signage requirements are under the jurisdiction of <u>Alberta Transportation</u>.
